Attached are the monthly financial statements for June & July 2024. The Town is currently at 83% of the fiscal year completed. The monthly financials are broken out by funds. Although the first column on the Revenue and Expenditure report is titled 2023-24 Amended Budget, this column only reflects a few budget adjustments in the Capital Project Fund. The original budget amount has not been increased nor decreased in the fund

Balance Sheet

The two columns shown on the Balance Sheet contains the ending balances for the fiscal year 2023 (first column) and the ending balances as of July 2024. The consolidated cash balance through July 2024 is \$1,592,932.78. The investment account balance as of July 2024 is \$3,990,756.46. The net revenue by fund for the current fiscal year through July is:

Revenue and Expenditure Report

The columns on the Revenue and Expenditure Statements are the 2024 Adopted Budget, the YTD revenue and expenditures, the variance of actual to budget and the percent of budget used through July 2024.

General Fund

Total revenue collected in the General Fund through July 2024 was \$3,532,643. Looking at the total revenues received excluding the Ad Valorem Taxes, revenues came in at 97% of the budgeted amount for the fiscal year.

The amount of the budgeted funds used in the General Fund through July 2024 is \$2,782,316. This amount reflects the transfer of property taxes to the Capital Fund of \$344,764 as well as all payments for the fire services contract with the City of Stuart of \$565,231. When removing those two figures for a more accurate representation of day-to-day operational costs and budget status, the Town has used \$1,872,320 or 73% of the budgeted expenditures for the fiscal year.

Building Fund

Total revenue collected in the Building Fund through July 2024 was \$359,128, which is 80% of the budgeted revenue.

Total expenditures for this fund through July 2024 are at \$348,227, or 77% of the budgeted expenditures, which is similar to funds spent through the same time-period last year.

Capital Fund

As of July 2024, revenue received in the Capital Fund was \$1,671,284. Looking at the total revenues received excluding grant reimbursements and the .40 millage transfer in from the general fund, revenues are currently at \$441,695, or 133% of budgeted amount for the fiscal year. The Town has received reimbursement of \$696,780 from Martin County for the water main replacement project and is expected to receive the first reimbursement payment of \$555,570 from FL DEP for the Septic to Sewer project in August.

Expenditures as of July 2024 are \$2,165,452 which is 12% of the current budgeted expenditures. This total includes the following: (numbers are approximate)

- Phase 3 (Design) \$100,000
- *North Sewall's Point RD (Preliminary Design) \$7,600
- Septic to Sewer (Part 1 Design & Construction) \$1,000,000
- Septic to Sewer (Part 2 Design) \$60,000
- Phase 2 (Design) \$69,000
- Martin County Water Main Replacement (Construction) \$697,000

Recommendation:

I. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Tompeck called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

a. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

Mayor Tompeck lead the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

b. Roll Call

The Town Clerk called the roll with the following Commissioners present: Mayor Tompeck, Vice Mayor Fender, Commissioner Barile, Commissioner Kurzman, and Commissioner Mayfield.

II. PROCLAMATIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

a. Captain Henry Sewall's Day Proclamation

The Town Clerk read the proclamation into the record. Mayor Tompeck presented the proclamation to Karen Neff, who thanked the Commission. Sandra Thurlow announced that it would be Captain Sewall's 100th birthday next year, along with Martin County celebrating their 100th year anniversary in 2025.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS- PLEASE SUBMIT A COMMENT CARD TO THE TOWN CLERK PRIOR TO THE START OF THE MEETING AND LIMIT YOUR COMMENTS TO THREE MINUTES. Extension of Time not permissible. No Time Extension permissible. If the thirty (30) minute time period has been exhausted, the Commission will entertain any remaining comments near the end of the meeting with the same three (3) minute per person time limitation.

There were no public comments heard.

IV. ADDITIONS, DELETIONS OR CHANGES TO THE AGENDA

There were no changes made to the agenda.

V. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

There being no discussion, Vice Mayor Fender **moved** to approve the Agenda. Commissioner Kurzman **seconded** the motion, which **passed unanimously** by roll call vote.

VI. CONSENT AGENDA

- a. Building Report July
- b. Minutes July 16, 2024 Regular Meeting

There being no discussion, Commissioner Kurzman **moved** to approve the Consent Agenda. Vice Mayor Fender **seconded** the motion, which **passed unanimously** by roll call vote.

VII. PUBLIC HEARING - ORDINANCE - SECOND READING

There was nothing scheduled under this item.

VIII. PUBLIC HEARING - ORDINANCE - FIRST READING

a. Ordinance No. 465 - Accessory Structure Appearance Requirements

The Town Attorney read the ordinance title into the record. Mayor Tompeck called for any public comments, to which there were none. The Building Official stated that the ordinance was being brought forward for approval, in order to enforce the prevention of large metal buildings being constructed in front yards.

Commissioner Mayfield and Mayor Tompeck were not in favor of Section 2 (c) that indicated accessory structures shall conform to surrounding charter of street, as it would be difficult to enforce. Commissioner Mayfield requested that it be removed from the ordinance. Mayor Tompeck recommended that the last sentence in Section 2 (d) be stricken in reference to articulated panels.

Vice Mayor Fender **moved** to approve Ordinance No. 465 with the exclusion of the last sentence in Section 2, Item (d) and to direct the Building Official and the Town Attorney to return with updated language regarding Item (c). Commissioner Kurzman **seconded** the motion, which **passed unanimously** by roll call vote. After further discussion, it was determined that Item (c) should be removed altogether.

b. Ordinance No. 466 - Regulating Use of Synthetic Turf

The Town Attorney read the ordinance title into the record. Mayor Tompeck called for any public comments, to which there were none.

Commissioner Mayfield requested clarification in reference to Section 82-484 (a), to which the Building Official responded that it was regarding the surrounding vegetation that shall be maintained. Commissioner Mayfield remarked that the section was not needed, as it was referenced in all other Town Codes.

Commissioner Barile stated that Section 82-482, Design Standards, Item d) referenced acquiring the materials in the United States and requested that it be stricken. The Town Attorney advised that the section could remain with the word 'preferable' inserted, as recommended by Mayor Tompeck. It was the **consensus** of the Commission to add the word 'preferably' before 'manufactured in the United States.'

Commissioner Barile stated that Section 82-483, Installation Standards, Item (a) referenced a licensed contractor was needed to install the synthetic turf, and pointed out that according to the state it was not required. It was the **consensus** of the Commission to amend Item a) as follows: 'Be installed in a manner prescribed by the manufacturer.'

Mayor Tompeck requested that Section 82.481, Synthetic Turf, Item (b) be amended by the Town Attorney to include permeable as opposed to impermeable. Commissioner Mayfield stated that Section 82-484, Additional Standards, Item (a) should be removed.

Dr. Chuck Farrow, 47 N. River Road, stated that he had no choice but to replace his lawn with synthetic turf, as it was infected with a mosaic virus.

There being no further discussion, it was the **consensus** of the Commission to direct the Town Attorney to amend the ordinance language as to Section 82-482, Item (d), add the word 'preferably' before manufactured in the United States; Section 82-483, Item (a), 'installed in a manner prescribed by the manufacturer,' and return for first reading at the August 27, 2024, Regular meeting; and to have the Building Official research percentage coverage ratios.

IX. RESOLUTIONS

a. Resolution No. 974 - Request for Moratorium - Accessory Structure Permits

The Town Clerk read the resolution title into the record. Mayor Tompeck called for any public comments, to which there were none. There being no discussion, Vice Mayor Fender **moved** to approve Resolution No. 974. Commissioner Mayfield **seconded** the motion, which **passed unanimously** by roll call vote.

X. OLD BUSINESS

There was nothing scheduled under this item.

XI. NEW BUSINESS

a. Ratification of DEP Water Quality Grants - Town Manager

The Town Manager stated that four grants were submitted to the state in the amount of \$14 million in a timely fashion. He requested that the Commission ratify the action he took in

applying for the following Water Quality Improvement Grants: S. Sewall's Point Area, Phase 2, Septic to Sewer; Phase 1, Part 4, S. Sewall's Point Road (S. River Road); Phase 2, S. Sewall's Point Road: and Phase 3, S. Sewall's Point Road.

Frank Tidikis, 12 Crane's Nest, stated that there were some discrepancies with the grant applications that should be reviewed by the Commission, and indicated that he would submit his comments to the Town Manager.

There being no further discussion, Commissioner Mayfield **moved** to ratify the Town Manager's decision to apply for the grants totaling \$14 million. Vice Mayor Fender **seconded** the motion, which **passed** by roll call vote with Mayor Tompeck, Vice Mayor Fender, Commissioner Kurzman and Commissioner Mayfield voting in favor, and Commissioner Barile voting against.

XII. DISCUSSION

a. Overview of FY2025 Budget

The Finance Director gave an overview of the FY 2025 budget, and recommended a 2.87 mill tax rate for the General Fund and .0.40 mill tax rate for the CIP with a combined millage rate of 3.27. She stated that the Fire-Rescue agreement would increase by \$197,830 this fiscal year and that next year it would be covered with the overages from the current year. Mayor Tompeck stated that the funds received from the increase in ad valorem tax would all be applied in its entirety to the fire rescue cost this year

The Town Manager stated that the budget would officially be adopted at the Budget Hearings scheduled for Monday, September 9, 2024 and Monday, September 23, 2024, both beginning at 6:00 p.m.

b. 78 S Sewll's Point Road Offer – Paulson Realty

The Town Manager stated that he had rejected the \$1 million offer, as \$2.2 million was invested in the property. Mayor Tompeck stated that the intent was to finish the STA's prior to the property being listed on the market.

Commissioner Kurzman was concerned that the Heritage lot had not been sold yet and suggested that a new real estate agent be hired. He requested that a status update item be placed on the next agenda meeting of August 27, 2024.

Scott Craft, 4 Delano Lane, stated that he wanted clarification that all offers on the property would be brought to the public's attention that were being entertained and would be open to everyone, to which the Town Manager and Mayor Tompeck responded in the affirmative.

c. Code Enforcement Board Vacancy

The Town Clerk recommended Gloretta Hall to fill the full board member vacancy. There

being no discussion, Commissioner Kurzman **moved** to approve Gloretta Hall as a full Code Enforcement Board Member. Vice Mayor Fender **seconded** the motion, which **passed unanimously** by roll call vote.

XIII. COMMISSION AND STAFF CLOSING COMMENTS

a. STAFF

The Town Manager stated that last year's collective bargaining agreement had an opener for wages and other issues, and that negotiations were scheduled for August 28, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. at Town Hall, which was a public meeting.

b. COMMISSIONERS

Mayor Tompeck stated that the 0.40 mills that were dedicated to the CIP had collected over \$900,090, to which \$175,000 had been dispersed for Phase 3 of the road project and that \$131,000 of it qualified for reimbursement. He pointed out that over the past three years only \$43,000 had been expended, and advised that \$250,000 would be spent to address the South River Road drainage issue. Mayor Tompeck clarified that \$700,000 remained in the account.

Commissioner Barile stated that he wanted to update the ordinance with Sections 10-1 and 10-3 involving pets, specifically dogs that were unleashed and aggressive. He was concerned, as there were prior incidents that turned fatal, and recommended an amendment to the ordinance because it was a safety issue. (See Attached)

Cynthia Lucas, 1 Mandalay Road, stated that her property had been flooding and that she was quoted \$22,000 to fix the issue previously. She hoped that the issue would be rectified.

Vice Mayor Fender inquired as to if it was legal to sell a vehicle on the street, to which Chief Ciechanowski responded that there was no regulation against it, but that there was a certain criteria for the sign.

XV. ADJOURN

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

Sec. 10-1. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Keep or *keeping* means to own, possess, maintain, care for, provide water or food for, harbor, provide shelter for (whether indoors or outdoors) or otherwise exercise control over.

Menacing means to present as a threat to the physical safety of a person or another animal as exhibiting by charging, growling, biting or snapping or other behaviors that causes an individual to have a well-founded fear for their safety or the safety of their animal that is subject to the threat.

(Ord. No. 393, § 2, 1-28-2014)

Sec. 10-3. Pets constituting nuisance or danger to health and safety.

- (a) No dogs or other pets shall be allowed to be offensive, infected with disease or otherwise become a nuisance, danger or threat to the health and safety of the inhabitants of the town.
- (b) It shall be unlawful to keep or maintain within the corporate limits of the town any animal or fowl which constitutes or creates a nuisance obnoxious to any inhabitant of the town or which may be detrimental to the health or safety of the inhabitants of the town.
- (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor, own or maintain any domestic pet which causes a noise disturbance by barking, yelping, howling, screeching, chirping, cawing, crowing or whistling for continuous periods of three minutes or more at any time.
 - Violations of this section shall be a class B violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18. Civil violations citations may also be issued under section 22-64 of the Town Code for violations of this section which also violate section 22-64 of the Town Code.
- (d) It shall be unlawful for any dog to be menacing or threatening to humans or other animals regardless of whether the dog is leashed at the time of the offense. The owner of the dog shall be the responsible party. Multiple victims shall be considered separate violations.
 - Violation of this section shall be a class C violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18.
- (e) It shall be unlawful for any dog to cause an unprovoked attack making physical contact with any person or animal regardless of whether the dog is leashed at the time of the offense. The owner of the dog shall be the responsible party. Multiple victims shall be considered separate violations
 - Violation of this section shall be a class D violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18.

Sec 10-6 County animal control ordinance adopted by reference.

The animal control ordinance of the county, presently codified as chapter 9 of the Martin County Code of Ordinances, is hereby adopted by reference as if fully set forth herein and made the applicable animal control ordinance within the Town limits.

Sec. 10-32. Running at large.

No dog shall run at large within the corporate limits of the town or upon property other than that of its owner unless the dog is running on property other than that of its owner with the express or implied consent of the owner of the property. A violation of this section shall be punished as provided in chapter 18.

Violations of this section shall be a Class A violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18.

Sec. 18-227. Schedule of fines.

The following is the schedule of fines for the Town of Sewall's Point:

- Class A violations. All class A violations shall be a civil offense punishable by a fine of \$100.00.
- (2) Class B violations. All class B violations shall be a civil offense punishable by a fine of \$150.00.
- (3) Class C violations. All class C violations shall be a civil offense punishable by a fine of \$250.00.
- (4) Class D violations. All class D violations shall be a civil offense punishable by a fine of \$500.00.
- (5) Class E violations. All class E violations shall be a civil offense punishable by a fine of \$50.00.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Town currently does not have a regulation governing the appearance of an accessory structure that is in the public view. There have been some structures constructed that did not match the quality and appearance of the main structure, causing some concern with maintaining the quality of life of area residents. Ordinance Number 465 will correct this oversight that has occurred with some properties. This ordinance was approved at First Reading with modifications at the August 13, 2024 Town Commission Meeting.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends adopting Ordinance No. 465 setting standards for the appearance of accessory structures visible to the public.

WHEREAS, the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida ("Town") is a duly constituted municipality having such power and authority conferred upon it by the Florida Constitution and Chapter 166, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, establishing reasonable regulations to enhance the aesthetic appeal of the community is a valid exercise of the Town's police powers to promote the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida finds that reasonable requirements governing the exterior appearance of accessory structures would enhance the aesthetic appeal of the Town's residential neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida, desires to amend Chapter 82, Zoning, Article IV, District Regulations, Division 2, Residential Districts, Subdivision IV, Dimensional and Supplementary

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF SEWALL'S POINT, FLORIDA THAT:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby fully incorporated herein by reference as legislative findings of the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point.

<u>Section 2.</u> Chapter 82, Zoning, Article IV, District Regulations, Division 2, Residential District, Subdivision IV, Dimensional and Supplementary Regulations, by adding a new Section 82-279, Accessory Structure Requirements, as follows (deletions are shown by overstrike; additions are underlined):

<u>Sec. 82-279 – Accessory Structure Requirements.</u>

- (a) Purpose. The purpose of this Section is to establish minimum appearance standards for detached structures that are permitted accessory uses located on the same residential lot as the principal use. As used herein, the term "accessory structure" shall include accessory dwellings and guesthouses, garages, carports, greenhouses, pool cabanas, gazebos, storage buildings, storage sheds, and other permitted accessory uses.
- (b) All accessory structures in the residential district that are visible from a public roadway shall be consistent with the

- primary structure in architectural design, exterior construction materials or façade treatment, roofline and color palette.
- (c) Accessory structures located on through lots and facing a public or private street other than the street where the primary structure is addressed shall conform and compliment the surrounding character of the area of said street.
- (d) A detached garage shall conform in appearance and design to the principal structure (house). The garage door must be designed to be an integral part of the building's architecture with trim, detailing and fenestrations. All residential garage doors for garages shall consist of articulated panels.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

<u>Section 4. Repeal of Laws in Conflict.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

First Reading

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Town currently does not have a regulation governing the installation and use of Synthetic turf for use in residential construction and in the area of right-of-ways. The use of alternate or synthetic turf adds to concerns for the permeability of the products used as well as the cost of replacing synthetic turf products should the Town need to perform work in any of the right-of-ways.

This Ordinance was originally presented at the August 13, 2024 Town Commission Meeting and several modifications were proposed, leading to resubmittal for First Reading. The modifications are as follows:

- Synthetic Turf is prohibited in the front yard.
- The restriction for products made in the USA was removed.
- The requirement that installation occur by a licensed contractor since there is no license for this type of installation.
- Clarifying that Town is not responsible for any repairs or replacements of the Synthetic Turf in the Right-of-way or easements.
- The owner is responsible for any maintenance of the Synthetic Turf.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approving Ordinance No. 466 at first reading setting standards for the use and installation of synthetic turf.

WHEREAS, the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida ("Town") is a duly constituted municipality having such power and authority conferred upon it by the Florida Constitution and Chapter 166, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida, desires to provide for and regulate the use of synthetic turf in landscaping; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida, desires to add to Section 82-1 a definition of the term "synthetic turf"; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida, desires to amend Chapter 82, Zoning, Article V, Supplementary Regulations by adding a new Division 7, Synthetic Turf.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COMMISSION
OF THE TOWN OF SEWALL'S POINT, FLORIDA THAT:

Ordinance No. 466 1 of 10 **Section 1.** The foregoing recitals are hereby fully incorporated herein by reference as legislative findings of the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point.

Section 2. Chapter 82, Zoning, Article I, In General, Section 82-1, Definitions, is hereby amended by adding a definition of "synthetic turf," as follows (deletions are shown by overstrike; additions are <u>underlined</u>):

Synthetic turf. A manufactured product that mimics the aesthetic look of natural grass, typically consisting of nylon, polypropylene, or polyethylene fibers connected to a reinforced backing material, installed over a base layer (infill medium) of gravel or stone and sand for drainage.

Section 3. Chapter 82, Zoning, Article V, Supplementary Regulations, is hereby amended by adding a new Division 7, Synthetic Turf, as follows (deletions are shown by overstrike; additions are underlined):

Sec. 82-481. -- Synthetic turf.

- (a) Synthetic turf may be permitted on all properties subject to the requirements and procedures set forth in this section.
- (b) Synthetic turf shall be included in the calculation of permeable

 area provided it complies with this subsection and all other
 requirements of this Code.
- (c) Synthetic turf shall not be counted towards the minimum required landscaped areas, buffers, foundation plantings or landscape islands.

Ordinance No. 466 2 of 10 (d) Failure to comply with the requirements and standards set

forth in this Division may be enforced through Town's Code

Enforcement procedures under Chapter 18 of this Code.

Sec. 82-482. Design standards.

Synthetic turf shall comply with all of the following design standards and shall:

- (a) Simulate the appearance of live turf, organic turf, grass, sod or lawn, and shall have a minimum eight-year "no fade" warranty.
- (b) Be of a type known as cut pile infill with pile fibers of a minimum height of 1.75 inches and a maximum height of 2.5 inches.
- (c) Have a minimum face weight of 75 ounces per square yard.
- (d) Be manufactured from polyethylene monofilament, dual yarn system,.
- (e) Have backing that is permeable.
- (f) Be lead free and flame retardant.

Sec. 82-483. Installation standards.

Synthetic turf shall comply with all of the following installation standards and shall:

(a) Be installed and maintained in a manner prescribed by the manufacturer.

- (b) Be installed over a subgrade prepared to provide positive

 drainage and an evenly graded, porous crushed rock

 aggregate material that is a minimum of three inches in depth.
- (c) Be anchored at all edges and seams consistent with the manufacturer's specifications.
- (d) Not have visible seams between multiple panels.
- (e) Have seams that are joined in a tight and secure manner.
- (f) Have an infill medium consisting of clean silica sand, small rocks or other mixture. Rubber pellets are prohibited. The manufacturer's specifications shall state that the infill:
 - (1) Must be brushed into the fibers to ensure that the fibers remain in an upright position;
 - (2) Will provide ballast to help hold the turf in place: and.
 - (3) Will provide a cushioning effect.

Section 82-484. Additional standards.

Synthetic turf shall comply with all of the following additional standards:

- (a) Synthetic turf shall be separated from planter areas and tree wells by a concrete mow strip, bender board or other barrier with a minimum four-inch thickness to prevent the intrusion of living plant material into the synthetic turf.
- (b) In the side yard and/or rear yard:

- (1) When entirely within private property. Synthetic turf shall be separated from the public right-of-way area by a vertical visual barrier at the property line, such as a hedge or fence. Any area outside the property line shall be landscaped with ground cover or living turf in the swale of the right-of-way or any other right-of-ways adjoining the property.
- into public right-of-way. (2) When extending Synthetic turf installed within private property, which also extends into the public right-of-way shall not require the vertical barrier at the property line, but shall require (1) a public works permit which may include additional conditions and requirements, including enhanced drainage mitigation to the satisfaction of the public works director to account for impact on the public right-of-way; and (2) a right-of-way encroachment agreement in form and substance acceptable to the town manager and town attorney. The Town will not be responsible for any damage done to the Synthetic turf in the right-of-way or easements. Any repairs and/or replacement will be at the property owner's expense and coordination.
- (3) Irrigation systems proximate to the synthetic turf shall be directed so that no irrigation affects the synthetic turf.

Sec. 82-485. Maintenance standards.

Synthetic turf shall comply with all of the following maintenance standards and shall:

- (a) Be maintained in an attractive and clean condition, and shall not contain holes, tears, stains, discoloration, seam separations, uplifted surfaces or edges, heat degradation or excessive wear. The property owner will be responsible for any expense involved in the maintenance of the Synthetic turf.
- (b) Be maintained in a green fadeless condition and free of weeds, debris, and impressions.
- (c) Synthetic turf must lie flat and resemble live grass.

Sec. 82-486. Prohibited uses.

The following uses of synthetic turf are prohibited:

- (a) Synthetic turf shall not be used in the public rights-of-way or swales, except as may be permitted and maintained in accordance with this subsection.
- (b) Synthetic turf shall not be used as a screening material where screening is required by this Code.

Sec. 487. Permitting.

All uses of synthetic turf shall require a building permit. The building permit application shall include, at a minimum, all of the following information:

- (a) A complete landscape plan showing the area of synthetic turf, area of living plant material, and area and method of separation between these areas. Minimum landscape requirements shall include minimum required trees and shrubs for new construction and pervious area calculations for all properties.
- (b) <u>Details regarding existing or proposed irrigation proximate to</u> the synthetic turf.
- (c) <u>Brand and type of synthetic turf, including all manufacturer</u> <u>specifications, warranties, and product lifespan.</u>
- (d) A scaled cross section and details of the proposed materials

 and installation, including but not limited to subgrade,

 drainage, base or leveling layer, and infill.
- (e) A survey of the property with a signed affidavit from the property owner that no changes have occurred since the date of the survey.
- (f) Previously installed synthetic turf. Synthetic turf existing on private property as of the effective date of this Ordinance may maintained as a nonconforming use as provided in Sec. 82-172 of this Chapter, subject to compliance with all maintenance standards in this subsection. For unpermitted synthetic turf installed in the public right-of-way, an adjacent property owner shall be required within 90 days of

Ordinance No. 466 7 of 10 the adoption of this ordinance to obtain a permit and comply with all requirements of this subsection for installation and maintenance of synthetic turf. For synthetic turf installed in the public right-of-way, the property owner will be allowed to keep the installation in the public right-of-way provided they request a permit 90 days after this ordinance is adopted and execute a release to the Town for any damages that might occur for any work the Town does or authorizes in the right-of-way or easements. Failure to comply with the permitting requirements of this subsection within the 90-day period shall constitute a continued violation of the Code and the property owner shall be required to immediately remove the synthetic turf from the right-of-way at the discretion of the Town Manager.

First Reading

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Town of Sewall's Point has an increasing problem with menacing dogs that run loose or are out of the control of their owner, biting individuals in the area. Ordinance 467 delineates a definition for menacing dogs and said offense constitutes a violation under the Town's Code of Ordinances. Menacing means to present as a threat to the physical safety of a person or another animal as exhibiting by charging, growling, biting or snapping or other behaviors that causes an individual to have a well-founded fear for their safety or the safety of their animal that is subject to the threat.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approving Ordinance No. 467 at first reading creating a violation for menacing dogs.

WHEREAS, the reasonable regulation of dogs and other pets is a valid exercise of the Town's police powers to promote the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida desires to amend the Town's Animal Ordinance to hold dog owners responsible for dogs that are menacing or threatening to humans or other animals, or that cause an unprovoked attack making physical contact; and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission further desires to make violations punishable by civil citation pursuant to Chapter 18, Division 2 of the Sewall's Point Code of Ordinances; and

Ordinance No. 467 1 of 7 WHEREAS, the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida, desires to further amend the Town's Animal Ordinance by adopting and incorporating by reference the Martin County animal control ordinance, currently codified as Chapter 9 of the Martin County Code of Ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF SEWALL'S POINT, FLORIDA THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> The foregoing recitals are hereby fully incorporated herein by reference as legislative findings of the Town Commission of the Town of Sewall's Point.

Section 2. Chapter 10, Animals, Article I, In General, section 10-1, Definitions, of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida, is hereby amended by adding a definition for the term "menacing", as follows: (deletions are shown by overstrike; additions are underlined):

Sec. 10-1. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Keep or keeping means to own, possess, maintain, care for, provide water or food for, harbor, provide shelter for (whether indoors or outdoors) or otherwise exercise control over.

Ordinance No. 467 2 of 7 Menacing means to present as a threat to the physical safety of a person or another animal as exhibiting by charging, growling, biting or snapping or other behaviors that causes an individual to have a well-founded fear for their safety or the safety of their animal that is subject to the threat.

Section 3. Chapter 10, Animals, Article I, In General, Section 10-3, Pets constituting nuisance or danger to health and safety, of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Sewall's Point, Florida, is hereby amended by adding new subsections (d) and (e) as follows: (deletions are shown by overstrike; additions are underlined):

Sec. 10-3. Pets constituting nuisance or danger to health and safety.

- (a) No dogs or other pets shall be allowed to be offensive, infected with disease or otherwise become a nuisance, danger or threat to the health and safety of the inhabitants of the town.
- (b) It shall be unlawful to keep or maintain within the corporate limits of the town any animal or fowl which constitutes or creates a nuisance obnoxious to any inhabitant of the town or which may be detrimental to the health or safety of the inhabitants of the town.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor, own or maintain any domestic pet which causes a noise disturbance by barking, yelping, howling, screeching, chirping, cawing, crowing or whistling for continuous periods of three minutes or more at any time.

Violations of this section shall be a class B violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18. Civil violations citations may also be issued under section 22-64 of the Town Code for violations of this section which also violate Section 22-64 of the Town Code.

(d) It shall be unlawful for any dog to be menacing or threatening to humans or other animals regardless of whether the dog is leashed at the time of the offense. The owner of the dog shall be the responsible party. Multiple victims shall be considered separate violations.

Violation of this section shall be a class C violation, punishable as set forth in Chapter 18.

(e) It shall be unlawful for any dog to cause an unprovoked attack making physical contact with any person or animal regardless of whether the dog is leashed at the time of the offense. The owner of the dog shall be the responsible party. Multiple victims shall be considered separate violations.

The animal control ordinance of the county, presently codified as chapter 9 of the Martin County Code of Ordinances, is hereby adopted by reference as if fully set forth herein and made the applicable animal control ordinance within the Town limits.

(a) <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Sec. 10-1. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Keep or *keeping* means to own, possess, maintain, care for, provide water or food for, harbor, provide shelter for (whether indoors or outdoors) or otherwise exercise control over.

Menacing means to present as a threat to the physical safety of a person or another animal as exhibiting by charging, growling, biting or snapping or other behaviors that causes an individual to have a well-founded fear for their safety or the safety of their animal that is subject to the threat.

(Ord. No. 393, § 2, 1-28-2014)

Sec. 10-3. Pets constituting nuisance or danger to health and safety.

- (a) No dogs or other pets shall be allowed to be offensive, infected with disease or otherwise become a nuisance, danger or threat to the health and safety of the inhabitants of the town.
- (b) It shall be unlawful to keep or maintain within the corporate limits of the town any animal or fowl which constitutes or creates a nuisance obnoxious to any inhabitant of the town or which may be detrimental to the health or safety of the inhabitants of the town.
- (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor, own or maintain any domestic pet which causes a noise disturbance by barking, yelping, howling, screeching, chirping, cawing, crowing or whistling for continuous periods of three minutes or more at any time.
 - Violations of this section shall be a class B violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18. Civil violations citations may also be issued under section 22-64 of the Town Code for violations of this section which also violate section 22-64 of the Town Code.
- (d) It shall be unlawful for any dog to be menacing or threatening to humans or other animals regardless of whether the dog is leashed at the time of the offense. The owner of the dog shall be the responsible party. Multiple victims shall be considered separate violations.
 - Violation of this section shall be a class C violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18.
- (e) It shall be unlawful for any dog to cause an unprovoked attack making physical contact with any person or animal regardless of whether the dog is leashed at the time of the offense. The owner of the dog shall be the responsible party. Multiple victims shall be considered separate violations
 - Violation of this section shall be a class D violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18.

Sec 10-6 County animal control ordinance adopted by reference.

The animal control ordinance of the county, presently codified as chapter 9 of the Martin County Code of Ordinances, is hereby adopted by reference as if fully set forth herein and made the applicable animal control ordinance within the Town limits.

Sec. 10-32. Running at large.

No dog shall run at large within the corporate limits of the town or upon property other than that of its owner unless the dog is running on property other than that of its owner with the express or implied consent of the owner of the property. Violations of this section shall be a Class A violation, punishable as set forth in chapter 18.

Sec. 18-227. Schedule of fines.

- (3) Class C violations. All class C violations shall be a civil offense punishable by a fine of \$250.00.

- (5) Class E violations. All class E violations shall be a civil offense punishable by a fine of \$50.00.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

On August 20, 2024, I was notified by the grants section of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Office of Resilience and Coastal Protection Program that we are being awarded \$2.75 million in additional funding in support of our Phase 3 project for fiscal year 2024-2025. Phase 3 is the resiliency project instituted to deal with flooding along South Sewall's Point Road from Ridgeland Drive to Pineapple Lane. The project includes stormwater treatment areas, filtered outfall lines, drainage for the roadway and the adjoining swales, and raising the roadway.

Funding for the project is committed from Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)/Florida Department of Emergency Management and FDEP. After receiving the original bids, it was obvious we would need to secure further commitments for funding from these sources. Hence the notification from FDEP with a requirement that we accept the funding by September 3, 2024. The current funding from FDEP does not have a match requirement and we are confirming with the program manager that there is no match involved with this additional funding.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends accepting the \$2.75 million in a grant from of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Office of Resilience and Coastal Protection Program.

HOMEWOOD / S. SEWALL'S POINT ROAD IMPROVEMENTS - PHASE 3 RE: **BID RESULTS**

Dear Commissioners & Mr. Daniels:

The following is a summary of the August 1, 2024 bid and the subsequent review of bid items with the bidder, J.W. Cheatham. We recommend that the Town accept the negotiated bid with Cheatham and move forward with construction.

Initial Bid Process / Results

On June 13, 2024, the Town requested bids for the S. Sewall's Point Road Phase 3 project, with the bidding period running from June to July 2024. Seven companies attended the non-mandatory pre-bid meeting. Ultimately, only one bid was submitted to Town Hall, which came from J.W. Cheatham, LLC, based in West Palm Beach, FL. This bid was publicly read aloud and on August 1, 2024 a summary of the bid is attached.

The base bid submitted was \$10,525,914.80, with additional bid amounts for three alternate items:

- Alternate A Miscellaneous Items: Establishes unit prices.
- Alternate B River Road/Marguerita Road Drainage: \$368,746.00.
- Alternate C Mandalay Lot 1 Area Drainage: \$76,125.00.

A Second Contractor attempted to bid but encountered computer software issues that prevented them from submitting on time. However, discussions revealed that their bid would have been higher.

Negotiated Bid Summary from Cheatham

On August 15, 2024, the Town Engineer met with J.W. Cheatham staff and their subcontractors to explore potential cost savings. Initial adjustments to the Asphalt Base, Curb Pads, Curb costs, Mobilization for overall project and some pipe costs have been reflected in the latest bid summary results of August 20, 2024. These adjustments also include reductions in Alternate A (Unit Price items) and Alternate B (River Road) bids.

Initial Bid Analysis / Grant Summary

The project is currently supported by grant funds, and it is divided into three parts:

- Part 1: FEMA HMGP funds are allocated for the middle area of the project, specifically in the area of the Homewood Subdivision. The negotiated bid for this section was \$4,034,911.11, while the available grant funding totals \$3,787,046.16. Based on the bid schedule, Part 1 will need \$247,864.95 of additional local funds.
- Parts 2/3: FDEP Resiliency funds are designated for the North end of the project, from the Ridgeland Subdivision to Homewood Subdivision and the South end, from Homewood Subdivision to Pineapple Lane. The bid for these areas was \$6,131,988.42, with available grant funding totaling \$5,970,000. Based on the bid schedule, Part 2/3 will need \$161,988.42 of additional local funds.

Based on the current improvement plan for HMGP & FDEP Resiliency North & South the Town may need to cover \$409,853.37 or explore cost reductions, eliminate some work, or secure additional funding sources to bridge the gap.

Additionally, the Town must consider the Construction (CEI)/Grant Administration costs, which could add approximately \$465,000 to the overall project cost.

Potential Additional Funding Sources

- Heritage Lot / 78 S. Sewall's Point Road Lot Sales: pending
- SWAG Grant FDEP funds: Recently submitted a \$1.5 million request.
- Tree Funds: Estimated at \$100,000, this project includes Tree Canopy Improvements

Information of Grant Funds

In 2023, the Town previously bid this project but the bids were excessive, prompting requests to FEMA and FDEP for additional funding and resulted in \$4,895,057.31 in extra funds. However, it is unlikely that further funds can be secured within the time frame needed to utilize the FEMA funds, which must be spent by March 31, 2026.

Conclusion

We recommend selecting J.W. Cheatham as the Contractor for this project. A final contract will be prepared based on the information provided within the next 30-days for approval.

J.W. Cheatham intends to complete work that will involve locating & potholing existing utilities, conducting a preliminary survey of potholes to assess potential utility conflicts & resolutions, managing shop drawings, material procurement and the manufacturing of precast components prior to the starting on-site maintenance of traffic/mobilization on January 6, 2025. Please also note that streets will not be torn up during holidays as the project enters the dry season. The Town may want to consider issuing the Notice to Proceed on the Alternate B (River Road/Marguerita Road) work at \$341,821 prior to this date. Please note the Design/Survey and CEI Task Order in amount of \$40,000 for Alternate B was previously approved.
